Wire Bridge Sno-Travelers

Wire Bridge Sno-Travelers Meeting February 16, 2013. Meeting called to order at 6:40 pm. Members present: Dave Carey, president; Lewis Wills, vice president, Judi Wills, treasurer; absent Joyce Knowles, secretary, Kendall Knowles, trail master. Other members present: Linda and Rick DeWolfe, Ken White, Kevin Bixby, Brad Bucklin, Bill Cafarelli.

Secretary Report was not read.

Treasurer Report was read. A review of all the expenses since last meeting were noted: bridge planks, nails, fuel for groomers, drag repair and other materials. Report was read and accepted. A review of trails and conditions was read. It was felt the trails looked good; brushing is an ongoing event but is very good. Bill, Brad and Kevin have kept at the brushing.

Signs are in good shape. Well marked trails. New map signs have been laminated and mounted onto plywood backing. The signs have been put onto trails with marks showing where the "snowmobiler is located," when looking at the sign. The club has received many compliments on how nice our maps are. Discussion and review on other trail work, bridges. This season most of the bridges have been replanked. Last week the bridge off Parson Stream was repaired. One bridge still needs replanking and the club will look at doing that next spring/summer; this is on the Swamp Man Trail. All planks are bought, as well as pressure treated building material for future work.

Discussion on an electric saw that was being considered for trail work. Lewis had talked to Jonathan Jordan about the saw, and Jonathan stated he would be getting some in soon. Kevin Bixby picked up a saw and brought it down to Lewis, they tried it a little. Kevin took it and worked on trail brushing. He reported back that it was not really what the club was looking for. It kicked back a lot. Discussion by Lewis as to brush saws and pole saws that are stored in garage that belong to the club. We should try using them or sell them if not what we want. Bill Capparelli spoke that he had one and used it all the time and really liked it.

Lew spoke of work he has done on the groomer recently; one thing was to build up cleats on the tracks so the groomer

would climb hills with ice with less problems. He has taken the groomer out and had no problems.

Discussion on trying to do clearing on a trail in order to change or widen the trail. Lewis said he would talk to the landowner and get back to the club. Dave Carey stated he rode an old trail to get off the plowed road for woods trucks. It was decided to try to groom it and see if that could get machines off plowed road.

Ken White spoke for the Activity Director, the club ride was re-scheduled to Saturday, February. 23, 2013. Everyone meet at West New Portland Church at 7:30 am. Ride would be to Clay Brook Lodge for a meal. The ride would continue from that point. If you have any questions contact Janine White.

Meeting adjourned at 7:05 pm.

The trail that was discussed earlier in notes has been groomed. It is a nice ride. Brushing needs to be done, but it is in good shape.
