## RSU 74 / School Board

The July school board meeting was held on July 10 at Carrabec Community School.

New Board Member: Ellen McQuiston of Anson joined the board.

Election of Chair and Vice Chair: Bob Demchak was reelected as board chair, and Troy Dunphy was re-elected as vice-chair. Neither election was contested.

Minutes: The minutes of the June board meeting were approved.

ESEA Grant: Jean Butler spoke about the Elementary and Secondary Education Act.

School Handbook Updates: The discussion of these updates was moved to the August meeting.

Facilities Update: Lorie Agren spoke about the work that her department has been doing this summer. The flat roof at CHS has been repaired, and a metal roof has been placed on the shed behind CHS, The entrances to CHS and CCS have been power washed. Tiles have been laid at the Solon School. The back shed at CCS has been cleaned. Caulk has been applied around windows at CHS, and a window at GS has been repaired. Painting has been done at Solon and parking lot issues have been addressed there. An area of concern is the concrete in the "old" portion of CCS. Mr. Tracy praised the work that has been done by Lorie and her crew. Both Tom Desjardins and lean Butler commended the work as well.

Superintendent Report: 1.) There will be a school board workshop at 5:00 pm on August 7. 2.) Mr. Tracy thinks it is important that schools promote the great things that are going on, and thinks that social media can be an effective tool to use for that purpose. He mentioned the possibility of having a district Facebook page in the near future. 3.) He will be meeting with the commissioner of education soon to discuss funding for rural communities. On the topic of funding, he said that in Maine state and local funds give schools 9% less funding than the national average.

Board Committee Assignments: The board reviewed and approved their committee assignments for 2019-2020.

Board Meeting Schedule: The board approved a meeting schedule for 2019-2020.

Operations Support Person: The board voted to approve Larry Dunphy as Operations Support Person for one year.

Computation and Declaration of votes for the 2019-2020 budget: The board approved the computation and declaration of the June budget vote.

To see if the Board will approve the Superintendent working with NESDEC for an independent enrollment report and to direct the Superintendent to provide requested financials. The board voted to approve.

This item does not necessarily indicate that a school will be closed or that a closure will be attempted. However, the intent of this item seemed to be to make sure that in the event that such an option is considered, the board has all of the relevant information and that the relevant information is accurate.
