### Selectmen's Meeting on February 21, 2022 Minutes

Roster: Selectmen: Raymond Poulin, Tina Poulin, Wayne Rundlett; Town Manager: Stacie Rundlett, Brian Rundlett, Craig Lehigh

- 1. Raymond called the meeting to order at 6:29 pm.
- The Board reviewed the minutes from previous meeting. Tina motioned to accept them as written, Wayne seconded and all were in favor.
- 3. Old Business: None
- 4. Items by the Public: The Board briefed Craig Lehigh on the approved project to use ARPA funds to purchase and install a new repeater antenna for the Fire Department.
- 5. Department Heads: None
- 6. Items by the Town Manager:
  - a. The Board reviewed and signed payroll, A/P warrants.
  - b. Stacie discussed with the Board the State of Maine Speed Trailer Loan Program, and asked if New Portland should participate. It was decided that New Portland would submit an application to participate and utilize the speed trailer at location(s) that would bring speed awareness to traffic.
  - c. Stacie reminded the Board of the Municipal Election March 4 and the Annual Town Meeting scheduled for Saturday, March 5 at 9:00 am. The meeting will be held in the bay of the Fire Station to accommodate the public and social distancing.

- d. The Board reviewed and signed the January 2022 treasurer's report.
- e. There was a brief discussion regarding the fire alarm in the Sand Salt Shed and how it operated.
- 7. Items by the Board of Selectmen:
  - a. The Board reviewed and signed a release deed for Ralph and Lynn Warren for payment of taxes.
  - b. The Board reviewed and signed appointment papers for Jianna Pinkham and Dillon Wellman to the Recreation Committee.

Wayne motioned to adjourn the meeting, it was seconded and all were in favor.

The meeting adjourned at 6:42 pm.

## RSU 74 / School Board

The March board meeting was held at Carrabec Community School. The meeting opened with the Pledge.

*Minutes: The minutes of the January board meeting were approved.* 

Masks: The board voted 11-1 to make mask wearing optional for the remainder of the school year in RSU 74. This applies to schools, buses, etc.

Superintendent Report: 1.) In the week following vacation, as of Wednesday night, there were only three cases of COVID district-wide. 2.) RSU 74 will solicit bids for property/casualty insurance. 3.) Mr. Tracy has talked with Detective Royle of the Maine State Police. Detective Royle is likely to do a presentation for parents and students about cyber crime before the school year is over. 4.) Budget season is here. The first budget meeting will be on March 16.

Appointments: Maurice Langlois - NHS Advisor, CHS; Stacey Robinson - NHS Advisor, CHS; Tamara McLean - ed tech; Kayli Addink - part-time ed tech.

Admin Reports: Most of the administrators chose not to add to the written report they had previously submitted to the board. Tim Richards noted CHS had held its first Student of the Month assembly in two years. Lorie Agren reported the CCS curtain has finally been fixed. Erik Carey gave the Athletic Director's report. The CCS girls' basketball team had 12 on the roster, and the CCS boys' basketball team finished with nine. At CHS, the bowling team had six members, girls' basketball had 18, and boys' basketball had 22. The CHS girls' basketball team finished the regular season with a record of 13-2, and advanced to the second round of the tournament. Milestones included Skip Rugh's 100th coaching win, and Cheyenne Cahill scoring her 1000th point. The CHS boys' basketball team finished the regular season with a record of 8-10, and advanced to the tournament in Augusta for the first time since 1998. Luke Carey passed the 1000th point mark during the season. Luke and Cheyenne became the third and fourth CHS basketball players to score 1000 points. Glenn Conners and Chris Lawrence were the first two players to score 1000. Mr. Carey noted that Glenn has been very supportive of the basketball teams all year, attending many games. Sign ups are in progress for spring sports: tennis, track, baseball, softball, etc.

Committees: The board's Finance Committee met on February 16 to go over the 22-23 budget. The district will likely receive about \$100,000 less in state subsidy next year. The cost of education is up about 7%. It is expected some carryover funds will be used to keep the local increase down for the taxpayers.

Public Participation: No one spoke.

After School Nutrition Program: The board voted to opt out. This was pretty much a formality, as the district has never participated in this.

Suspending Policy BD-R: The board's policy on adopting new policies was temporarily suspended. This was done so as to allow the board to immediately adopt some policies that are now required by state law.

New Policy: GBGB The board adopted policy GBGB. This is a Workplace Bullying policy.

Revised Policies: ACAB-R, BBAAA, JLCB, JIC, JKD, JKE-R, and JLF

Policy BBAAA was sent back to the policy committee. The other policies were approved.

Architect/Engineer: The board voted to hire an architect/ engineer for the CCS roof.

Adjournment: The meeting ended around 7:15 pm.
