The December 7 school board meeting was held at Garret Schenck, Board chairman Troy Dunphy noted that it was the 81st anniversary of Pearl Harbor. He spoke about how the nation came together after the attack and seemed to imply that it would be good if something similar were to occur at this time.

Adjustments to the Agenda: Agenda item eight was removed from the agenda.

Minutes: The minutes of the November meeting were approved.

Presentation: There was no presentation this month.

Superintendent Report: Mr. Campbell thanked Jean Butler for the place-settings at the board's table and also for the snacks. (Editorial comment ... The chex mix was outstanding.) Mr. Campbell attended the GS Christmas show on Tuesday, and he commended lean, her staff, and the students for a great performance. He noted that Lesa Weggler was the recipient of the December Staff Spotlight Award. He said she is involved with SAT and teacher mentoring. Mrs. Weggler models various teaching strategies which help her students learn. Mr. Campbell shared financial info with the board.

Admin Reports: 1.) Neither Mr. Greene nor Mrs. Cram had anything to add to their written reports. 2.) Mr. Hall was not present, as he had a family commitment. 3.) Jaime Ela reported that the CCS RTI/behavior committee met last week. The meeting went well and some short term adjustments were made. Green Cobra Stamps are being used to reward k-5 students for good behavior, and Candy and lenah created a behavior themed bulletin board. Mrs. Ela commended staff members who have decorated classroom doors or other areas of the building as the holidays approach. She was enthusiastic about today's grade 4-12 chorus/band rehearsal at CCS. She said that the kids did a great job, and so did Lindsay Burke and Samantha Taylor in preparing the students. The performance is December 8. 4.) Robert Greene added his crew had done a great job setting up the CCS gym in preparation for the rehearsal and the Thursday performance. 5.) Jean Butler welcomed the board members to Garret Schenck. She said that the candy cups at the board table were prepared by Valerie Pinkham's pre-k students. Students and staff are busy with holiday related activities. She was pleased to be able to host the first Christmas show in three years. 5.) Athletic Director Erik Carey said the CHS boys basketball trip to Aroostook County went well. He thanked Mr. Greene for helping to make the trip possible. The CHS girls' basketball team opens up on Friday, and the boys' basketball team will play its season opener on Saturday. 6.) Peter Campbell said that improving the school culture is still a focus at CHS. He hopes to get large crowds at home sporting events and will offer cash prizes to students who can hit half court shots during halftime. He invited the board members to attend basketball games. He said that the November Dinner Theater performance was a success. Mr. Campbell has been visible in the community, visiting local businesses and running in the Turkey Trot. He answered a question from a board member regarding differentiated instruction.

Student-rep William Price said CHS students are enthusiastic about the winter sports season and Christmas. Bowling practice has begun. William showed a slideshow of recent student activities including the Performing Arts team's meal at Governor's.

Committees: A board committee will meet on Jan 4 to discuss the superintendent's salary and benefits. On Jan 11, the policy committee will meet.

Public Participation: No one spoke.

Policies: Policies AC, ACAA, ACAB, and GCFB were approved for second reading.

Procedures: Procedures ACAA-R and ACAB-R were approved

Policy ACAAA: This item was in the agenda, but it was removed from the agenda at the outset of the meeting.

January 2: The school calendar lists Monday, January 2, as a school day. The board voted to change the calendar. After vacation, school will now resume on Tuesday, January 3. The last student day will be on Monday, June 12. After School Nutrition Program: The board opted out of this, as has historically been the practice.

Breakfast After the Bell Requirements: The board opted out of these requirements, as has been recent practice.

Budget Timeline: The board adopted a budget timeline. I did not see the timeline, but if it is similar to the budget timelines from as far back as I can remember, there will be several budget meetings in March. Most usually fall on Wednesdays.

Adjourn: I forgot to check the clock, which I normally do - whoops. I believe, the meeting ended a little bit before 7:00 pm.
