The Meeting: The September school board meeting was held at the New Portland Fire Station. The meeting began with the Pledge of Allegiance.

Adjustments to the Agenda: Several appointments were added to the agenda. One item, "To see if the RSU #74 Board of Directors will approve the 8th grade overnight trip to Boston on September 30th and October 1st" was removed from the agenda.

Minutes: The minutes of the August 9 board meeting and the August 16 special board meeting were approved.

Presentation: There was no presentation.

Superintendent Report: Mr. Campbell informed the board that he would like to hold a board workshop session to look at stipends.

Admin Reports: 1.) Tara Morin thanked the board for hiring her. She described the CCS staff as being "awesome, amazing, and wonderful". She said the students were "great". A board member asked about 6-8 recess. Currently, students in grades 6-8 do not have recess. Mrs. Morin indicated the previous principal told her that middle school recess had gone very poorly in 2022-23 with numerous discipline issues. Mrs. Morin said she will survey the staff to see how they feel about recess in 2023-24. 2.) Jean Butler noted the increased number of students at GS and Solon. Part of the increase is attributed to the change in busing/attendance zones. There have also been a number

of students who have moved into RSU 74 territory. As of Wednesday night, there were 89 students at GS and 91 at Solon. 3.) Student board rep Kayliy Folco reported on the happenings at CHS. Jobs for Maine Graduates has given out \$8000 to students. JMG students are working towards their Maine Career Exploration Badge. Trunk or Treat will be held on October 16. There is a waiting list of students eager to take art classes and culinary arts class. The CHS band has quadrupled in size in one year. Mr. Mason is teaching six classes, and Mr. Collard's pre-calc classes are off and running. 4.) Peter Campbell praised Kayliy, saying that she is a threesport athlete. She is a student in good standing with senior privileges, and she is easy to work with. Student numbers are up at CHS. 22 seniors graduated. They have been replaced by a senior class of 63. Things are going well to start the year at CHS. Teachers are working hard and helping to solve any early problems that have arisen.

Public Participation: Erik Carey asked why the agenda item pertaining to the Boston trip had been removed. Board chairman Troy Dunphy did not feel there was any need for the board to get involved. There was a long discussion about this topic.

Update of the Comprehensive Emergency Plan: The primary change was to remove the name of the previous CCS principal and add Tara Morin's name to the plan. Mrs. Morin stated, "I love my job!"

Maine Huts and Trails: The board approved the September 2021-22 trip.

Cooperative Cheering: The board approved a cooperative CHS/Madison football cheering squad.

Adjournment: The meeting ended at 7:05 pm.
