Minutes for the Selectmen's Meeting for June 17, 2024

Roster/ Selectmen: Raymond Poulin; Janet White; David Veilleux; Stacie Rundlett, Town Manager; David Cary; Garrett Oswald; Lynne Pieren; Jane Shattuck; Andrea Reichert; Brittany Rundlett (and Amelia), Jacob Pinkham, Brian Rundlett.

- 1. Janet called the meeting to order at 6:30 pm.
- 2. The Board reviewed the minutes from the previous meeting. Ray motioned to accept the minutes as written, David seconded and all were in favor.
- 3. Old Business: a.) Stacie updated the Board about the new town digital sign. b.) There was a brief discussion on the three picnic tables built by David and Zach Cary and Wayne Rundlett. Two are at the Wire Bridge area and one is at the playground area at the fire station. The Board thanked the men for their time and complimented them on their work. c.) There was a brief discussion regarding Gilman Pond Road maintenance, near Jane Shattuck's property. David motioned to open Gilman Pond Road approximately 250 feet from current end of the road for summer road maintenance. Raymond seconded and Janet abstained. David motioned to open Gilman Pond Road approximately 250 feet from the current end of the road for winter maintenance with the understanding the current land owners who abut the road will grant the Town of New Portland an easement to put a turn around for town of New Portland's equipment and/or equipment employed by the town of New Portland access; Raymond seconded and Janet abstained. Both motions passed.
- 4. Items by the Public: Andrea Reichert asked questions about voting day and why a couple of the ballot clerks were not notified until the evening before that they were not needed on voting day. The Town Clerk, Jacob Pinkham, spoke about how and why this happened and clarified it was his error in communication, and he would make sure that this didn't happen again.

- 5. Department Heads: a.) Janet motioned to pay for the picnic tables out of recreation funds; Raymond seconded and all were in favor. b.) Janet updated the other board members on the conversation she had with the Road Commissioner Ron Nunes, who was unable to attend. No decisions were made.
- 6. Items by the Town Manager: The Board reviewed and signed the payroll and A/C warrants.
- 7. Items by the Board of Selectmen: a.) The Board opened and reviewed the winter sand bids. The bids were as follows: 1. Jordan Excavation \$15.85 per yard = 36,455; 2. Cousineaus -\$19.76 per yard = 45,450. Janet motioned to accept Jordan Excavation's bid; Ray seconded and all were in favor. Stacie will call Jordon Excavation to notify them. b.) Raymond motioned to enter into executive session pursuant to M.R.S.A. §405(6)(A) Personnel Matters at 7:04 pm. Raymond motioned to enter back into the public meeting at 7:22 pm.

David spoke to Andrea Reichert that there was a discussion regarding the ballot clerks and moving forward there will be better communications with all parties involved.

The meeting was adjourned at 7:24 pm.

Superintendent of Schools

July 16, 2024

Dear Residents of New Portland,

This month neither the full Board or any of the subcommittees meet so my report will be short.

As I spoke of this spring during our budget process, we had three major projects in the budget proposal. If you have been past the Solon Elementary School you likely noticed that the parking lot area in front of the school has been completely replaced. The project included the removal of the remaining existing tar, a new sublayer of gravel compacted, with new surface rolled down. The project also included new curbing and a handicap accessibility point for the sidewalk. The bid also included lining parking spots and a zone for fire protection in front of the building which is scheduled to be done in the next two weeks to complete that project.. The second project in progress is the replacement of the tiles in the older section of CCS. I say older because the old brick portion of the Mark Emery building was renovated in the construction of the Community School. The tiles did not hold us as well on the older cement base. The third project is the replacement of the exterior lights at the high school. That is expected to begin a little later this month.

Besides the projects we have put out to bid, the maintenance personnel are doing some smaller projects. At Solon, the crew is giving the tower a face lift. In Anson, there is a beam in the entranceway that needs to be replaced. Currently, the crew is doing repairs to the HVAC system at the high school. It has been determined that some of the water leakage in the classrooms comes from holes in the system. So besides preventive maintenance, the crew is making repairs to lessen the likelihood of storm water damaging ceiling tiles.

We are beginning the bid process for securing a lease/loan for the bus that was also part of the 2024-2025 budget. Our hope is to complete the necessary paperwork and get final Board approval to allow us to take possession in time to get the necessary radio and cameras installed so that it is rolling on opening day. The new bus is a Thomas with a diesel engine and will be replacing a bus that has been costly to maintain over the past couple years. It isn't our oldest but still costs us more to keep running than a couple of the older ones.

The next meeting of the RSU #74 School Board Directors is scheduled for August 7 in the Carrabec Community School library. Please do not hesitate to reach out to me at mcampbell@carrabec.org if you have any questions. Respectfully...
